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



The Finance Minister stated that there will be no income tax levied up to an income of Rupees Two Lakhs, but when the finance bill came to the records, it was evident that the media has spread a myth.

> As per clause 8 of the bill, amendment of Sec 87A of the Income Tax Act was requested to provide relief to the individual tax pavers by increasing the maximum amount of tax rebate to Rs. 12,500 from the existing rebate of Rs. 2,500. Rebate is now admissible to tax payers having a total income upto Rs. 5 lakhs instead of Rs. 3.5 lakhs. So, there is no change in the tax slabs and there is no exemption to the individuals whose total taxable income (after all deductions) is more than Rs. 5 lakhs.



'A Trip to the Moon" is justly the most popular early film. This movie is more amusing and imaginative. It's

better than Georges Méliès's other surviving pictures because it has a more developed story. A Trip to the

Moon is the most famous of the over 500 short films produced by cinema pioneer Georges Méliès between

1896 and 1912, and its signature image of a bullet-shaped rocket lodging itself in the eye of a smirking

moon is one of the most recognizable images in the history of cinema. An accomplished magician, Méliès

moved from simple recordings of his stage shows to dazzling fantasy epics which were among the first

narrative films ever made. These "trick films" combined fantastic yarns, intricate painted sets, and

elaborate costumes with such simple but effective special effects as slow motion, dissolves, and superim

positions. The "30 tableaux", as Méliès called it, is linked by dissolves--a common transition at the time,

which Méliès introduced. Méliès made it known that his goal was to push cinema towards resembling heatre. The benefit was longer films with more developed stories. Given this, it's ironic that Méliès was one

of the first filmmakers to achieve effects specific to motion pictures i.e. the trick shots
